Project Specific Objectives:

1. Improving the intervention efficiency of the emergency services in the cross-border area by developing the common training infrastructures and by modernizing the dispatch centre from the Ukraine.
2. Development of a common cross-border operational framework for emergency situations (including interventions in mountainous areas), by conducting common training sessions and cooperation exercises and by drafting a joint cooperation plan.
3. Increasing the common operational capacity of all partners by procuring special vehicles, technical means and equipment.

Implementation Period of the project is 27.06.2019 – 13.12.2022 and benefits from a total budget of 7,416,592.50 euros, of which non-reimbursable financing from the European Neighbourhood Instrument (ENI): 6,675,000.01 euros.
